Justice40

➤ 40% of EV Program benefits are delivered to Disadvantaged Communities (DACs)

- ❖ Tribal Nation, Women, Black, Latino, Asian American Pacific, Indigenous, and other historically underrepresented groups
- ❖ Charging Sites (Access, Zero Emissions)
- ❖ Affordable Charging Rates
- ❖ Job Training/ Workforce Development/ Entrepreneurship
 - Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Participation
 - Ownership, Installation, Operation, Maintenance, Apprenticeships

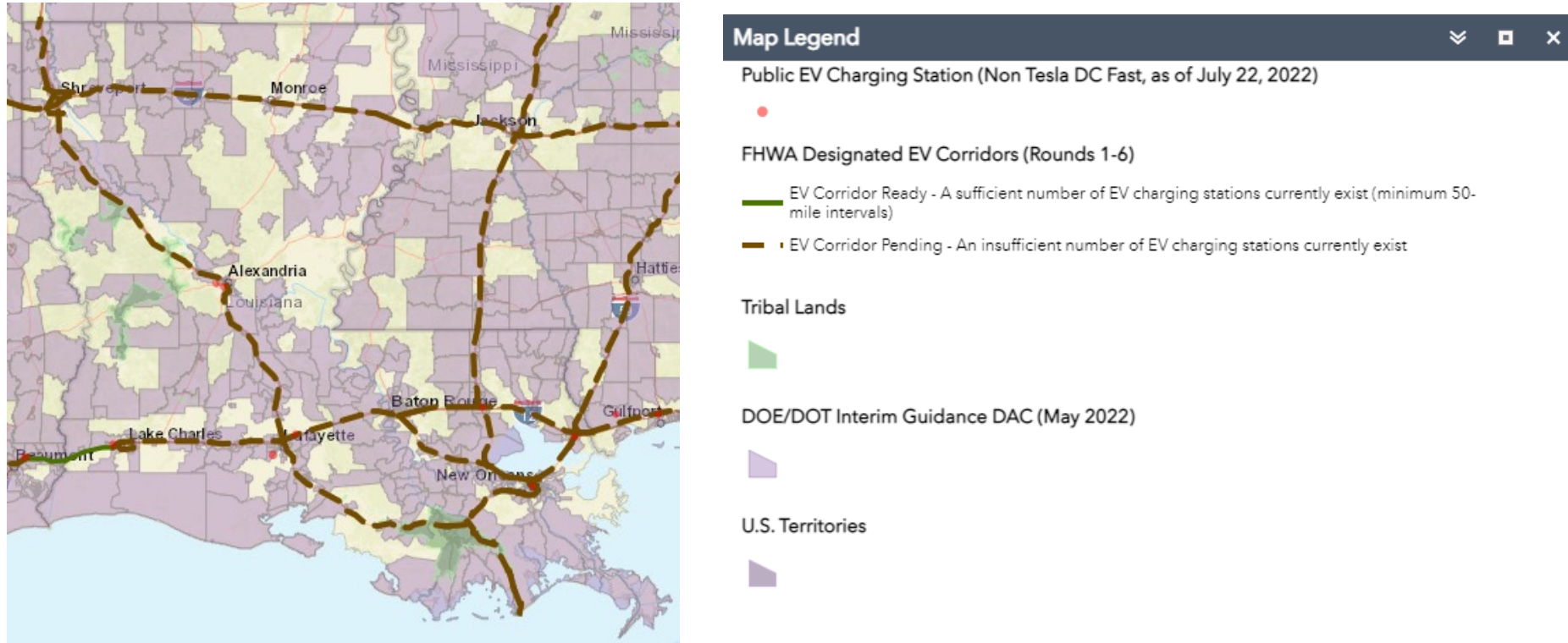

Electric Vehicle Charging Justice40 Map Tool

- The U.S. Department of Transportation developed an interim definition of “disadvantaged communities” or DACs
- Under their definition, approximately 11% of U.S. Census tracts are considered disadvantaged communities
- The definition takes into account:
 - Energy burden
 - Fossil fuel dependence
 - Resilience
 - Climate hazards
 - Health disparities
 - Transportation access
 - And more

EV Charging – Justice40 Map

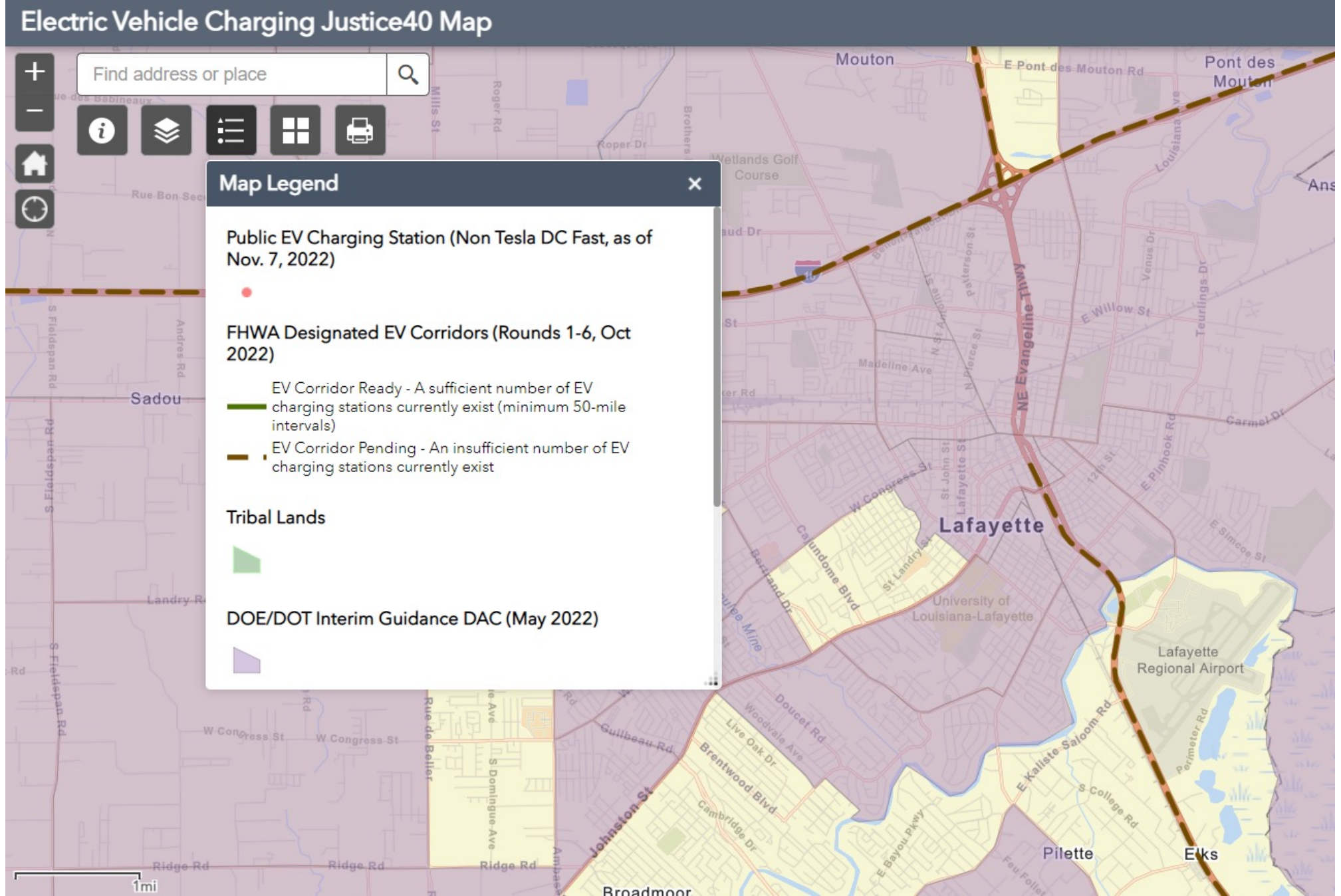
